THE CDSM DIRECTIVE'S REGULATION REGARDING THE PROTECTION OF PRESS PUBLICATIONS AND ITS IMPLEMENTATION IN HUNGARY

In the research paper the hypothesis is proposed that Article 15 of the CDSM Directive and the protection it introduces under a new neighbouring right will effectively change the press publishers' legal position, especially in relation to information society service providers and create a more sustainable environment. The cornerstones of the research are to describe the development of copyright environment, to define the scheme of neighbouring rights and to explain the path leading to the CDSM Directive. The international and domestic implementation of the CDSM Directive and the initiative to establish a national level collective right management system for the new neighbouring right are also examined.

"THERE ARE QUESTIONS TO WHICH IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO GIVE ANSWERS". THE THIRD EPOCH OF THE WOLFNER FACTORY IN ÚJPEST

In the third part of the series of articles the effects of World War II on the Wolfner family and their factory are described. The factory reached its maximum in production before the war, a large proportion of its products – different types of shoes – was exported to England. This prosperous industral activity was interrupted by the war when the Wolfner factory became one of the biggest suppliers of the army. After the German occupation the managers/owners were deprived of their jobs, a lot of workers were deported, the stocks were transported to Germany. After 1945 the surviving László Wolfner got back the factory, which was at last nationalized in March 1948.
